WHY 40 DAYS?

In just 40 days, a lot can happen! It may seem short, but the Bible tells us that during this time, God has used 40 days to work miracles, change people's hearts, and help them become better in big ways.

Here are a few examples of how God has shown Himself powerful in just 40 days.

- Genesis 7:12 | Noah and his family were on the ark while God was remaking the earth via the rain and flood over 40 days.
- Exodus 34:28 | Moses spent 40 days on Mount Sinai where God released the Ten Commandments.
- Numbers 13:25 | The ten spies spent 40 days in the Promised Land.
- 1 Samuel 17:16 | Young David was challenged and transformed by Goliath's 40-day challenge.
- Jonah 3:4 | The city of Nineveh was changed by the teaching of the prophet Jonah about what the next 40 days had in store for them should they not repent.
- Luke 4:2 | Jesus was empowered for ministry by spending 40 days in the wilderness.
- Acts 1:3 | The disciples were transformed by spending 40 days with Jesus after the Resurrection.

These stories from the Bible teach us that when a group of people gather and have faith in God—through times of testing, purifying, and preparing—He can and does change them.

Our focus for 40 Days of Faith is twofold: first, to water the seeds of faith in your life, and second, to guide you toward spiritual growth. Both are essential to your faith becoming stronger and living a life full of hope and determination. Are you ready to take the next step? Let's start this 40 day spiritual journey together and discover how to nurture our faith.

WHY CONNECT GROUPS?

The Connect Groups ministry at Linked UP North has a simple purpose – to make life-changing relationships relevant and accessible. We believe God created us to live in community—not isolation—building heartfelt relationships with one another.

And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another, especially now that the day of his return is drawing near.

Recap

CONNECT 40 WEEK 2: FAITH TO OVERCOME

Recap

What is the substance and purpose of faith? Faith helps us overcome challenges and makes our hopes and dreams become reality. Having it is like wearing special glasses that change how we see things. By growing our faith and trusting in God's promises, we can find the strength to face any situation and believe that good things will happen.

Pastor George discussed this in Connect 40: Week Two, sharing five fundamentals of faith. We learned that faith is believing for something and expecting a result. We can have faith for things such as healing, help, and protection because God gave us all faith to overcome these circumstances. We need to develop our personal faith to make it stronger and apply it in different situations.

We have all heard the saying, "I'll believe it when I see it." That's "natural faith." As born-again believers, we are called to have a different kind of faith—one that believes even when we can't see it or when things don't look favorable. As our faith grows, we can more confidently speak about what we believe and trust that it will happen. Having faith in our hopes and dreams is crucial for believers because it helps us connect with God's power and provision.

Faith keeps us encouraged and charged up. It enables us to remain confident in our desired outcomes. With faith, we can look at any situation and declare, "God, no matter what happens, I know You are in control. I believe You have been with me before, and You will make a way for me." It takes energy to stand—to stand in faith. We are supercharged by studying and knowing God's Word that we speak over any challenge. So let's charge up our spiritual batteries and get ready for the amazing things that our loving and caring Father has planned for us!

CONNECT 40 WEEK 3: FOUR FOUNDATIONS OF FAITH

Recap

During this week's message, we focused on constructing strong faith projects by delving into four pillars of faith. The first pillar emphasizes believers growing their hopes into solid faith by believing in God's existence and accepting the Bible as His written Word. Knowing His Word equips us with a thorough faith vocabulary applicable to any situation. Therefore, solely holding onto hope for the fulfillment of God's promises alone is inadequate. By integrating belief in God's Word with hope, we become righteous in God's eyes, fulfilling this crucial aspect of faithful believers.

The second pillar to strengthen our faith is talking about our beliefs and desired outcomes. True faith that brings deliverance, freedom, and wholeness goes beyond reading and thinking about God's promises. It's about having complete trust in Jesus as our Lord and Savior. When we truly believe in our hearts, we naturally want to share our hopes and God's Word with others. By confidently speaking and aligning our words with God's promises, we can make things happen according to His plan. Just like God created things by speaking, we have that same power.

The third pillar explains that when we truly believe in something, we prove it through our actions. Faith is not just about believing but also about what we do. Our actions don't try to make God do things for us because He has already done everything. Our works are a way of honoring what God has done for us and to build strong faith that can endure tough times. We can learn more about living faith by studying the stories of Rahab (Joshua 2:8-13) and Abraham (Genesis 15:6).

CONNECT 40 WEEK 3: FOUR FOUNDATIONS OF FAITH

The fourth pillar of faith emphasizes the vital role of love in our lives. According to Galatians 5:5-6, when we walk by faith, love becomes a priority because faith works through love. Love serves as the motivator for our faith, just as electricity powers our mobile phones. The stronger our love, the stronger our faith becomes.

In conclusion, by incorporating these four pillars of faith—believing in God's Word, speaking about our beliefs and desired outcomes, demonstrating faith through actions, and prioritizing love—we can construct strong faith projects that withstand the tests of life. Let us embrace these pillars and nurture our faith, knowing that our beliefs, actions, and love work together to strengthen our connection with God and fulfill His purpose for us.

Recap

Believers possess the power to intervene in their circumstances through faith-filled words. These spoken words impact the spiritual realm before manifesting in our lives. Our choices and words directly influence our present situations.

In addition to seeking God's intervention through prayer, we can also learn from Jesus' example in Mark 11:14. Rather than petition God through prayer, He used his authority to boldly speak to a fig tree and change took place within a day. This demonstrates that faith, resembling God's nature, is not a passive belief. It is an active force available to each of us that allows us to release God's power into our circumstances by speaking faith-filled words.

God has provided us with clear instructions on exercising His kind of faith. Message Recall

Having faith and taking action are crucial! This week's message reminded us about the importance of faith in overcoming challenges and winning spiritual battles. As believers, we have an advantage because we know that faith, not just willpower or intelligence, leads us to victory. Our Savior has already conquered the world, giving us peace and confidence that it can no longer harm us (John 16:33).

WEEK SIX

Recap

During the sixth week of the 40 Days of Faith journey, the focus was on the power of prayer and living by faith. Praying in faith involves:

- Finding a promise in God's Word that aligns with our specific needs.
- Bringing that Scripture to God in prayer.
- Receiving His answer.
- Expressing gratitude for His provision.

When we live by faith, it becomes the assurance of the things we hope for, being the proof of things we do not see and the conviction of their reality (Hebrews 11:1 AMP). When we walk by faith and not by sight, we rely on confidence in the Word of God and follow the Holy Spirit's guidance, thereby avoiding doubt. The Bible encourages us to walk, stand firm, live, overcome challenges, grow in sanctification, and experience justification through faith. Even in trials, we should demonstrate genuine faith by remaining strong and trusting in God. Thomas doubted Jesus' resurrection until he saw proof, highlighting the importance of walking by faith, not by sight.

The Bible repeatedly emphasizes the significance of faith. For example, the saints are commended for loving God without demanding visible proof of His existence by choosing to walk by faith instead. The story of Abraham and Sarah, an inspiring example, tells how they conceived a child despite natural impossibilities.

Walking by faith entails hearing God's Word, believing it in our hearts, confessing it with our mouths, and acting upon it. It is a comprehensive approach that involves aligning our thoughts, words, and actions with God's Word allowing us to experience God's grace and witness His miraculous power.

Faith Project Action Steps

Our focus for 40 Days of Faith was twofold: first, to water the seeds of faith in your life, and second, to guide you toward spiritual growth by growing and developing your faith. As we conclude the spiritual concentration, whether your faith project manifested or not, you can keep building by consistently practicing these powerful principles to incorporate into your life.

- Hear: Take the time to listen attentively to what the Word of God says about your life and the promises God has for you. As Romans 10:17 NKJV states, faith comes by hearing the Word of God. The Bible is a rich source of wisdom, guidance, and encouragement. Regularly reading and studying the Word can deepen your understanding of God's character and His plans for your life.
- <u>Believe</u>: Once you have heard the promises of God, it's important to believe that those things will be done. Mark 11:22-24 NKJV encourages us to have faith in God and believe that what we ask for in prayer, according to His will, will be granted. Trust in God's faithfulness and His ability to fulfill His promises.

- <u>Confess</u>: Hold fast to your confession of faith. Speak out your beliefs and affirm them with your words. Hebrews 4:14 NKJV reminds us to hold firmly to our confession of faith, declaring our trust in God and His promises. Your words have power, so use them to align your thoughts and actions with the truth of God's Word.
- <u>Do</u>: James 1:22 NKJV reminds us not to be mere hearers of the Word but also doers. Faith requires action. Apply the teachings of the Bible to your daily life and live out your beliefs. Act in obedience to God's commands and His leading. Your actions should reflect your faith in God and His promises.
- Thank: Express gratitude to God for His faithfulness and for answering your prayers even before you see the physical manifestation. Philippians 4:6 NLT encourages us to approach God with thanksgiving as we present our requests to Him. Colossians 4:2 AMP urges us to be persistent in prayer and to maintain an attitude of thanksgiving. Trust that God hears your prayers and is actively working on your behalf.

By incorporating these practices into your life, you can cultivate a lifestyle of faith. Remember that faith is a journey, and it grows as you deepen your relationship with God and apply His Word in practical ways.

CONNECT 40 ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

H.O.S.T.ing a Group

- Have a Group
 - Start with people who are already in your sphere of influence (coworkers, friends, neighbors).
 - Find people around you who are new to the church, new believers, or have shown interest in getting involved.
 - Look for people who you think you can help draw out their potential.
 - Pray for God to send people to you who you haven't already discovered.
- Open Your Home
 - We encourage all Connect Groups to meet outside of the church building if possible.
 - If you cannot meet in your own home, look for a host home (possibly the home of someone attending your group).
 - Other possibilities for meeting locations include:
 - Library
 - Conference Room
 - Recreation Center
 - Subdivision Clubhouse
 - Just a Park
 - Restaurant
 - Coffee Shop
- Serve a Snack
 - Have food and snacks available
- Talk it Out
 - Make time for talking and sharing ideas in your group. Follow the "70-30" rule, where members speak about 70% of the time and the host speaks about 30% of the time.

CONNECT 40 ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

- Keep the conversation positive and focused. Bring the discussion back to the main topic if it goes off track. If sensitive or complex issues come up, address them privately after the meeting.
- Make sure everyone can join in the conversation. Remember that some people may not understand certain phrases or terms we use, like "spiritual warfare."
- Be ready to adjust the direction of the meeting if necessary. The most important thing is to create a loving and accepting environment for everyone.

Connect Group Meeting Agenda

- Casual Fellowship. A laid-back time for group members to talk and get to know each other or just fellowship if you're already acquainted.
- Activity or Discussion. This will vary based on what kind of group you're leading. It could be an activity like frisbee, outreach, or a discussion about a book or Sunday message. For Connect 40 we are studying the weekly messages delivered by Pastor Gregory during Sunday services.
- Prayer. Start by asking group members if they have anything to celebrate or if they need prayers. It's important to recognize and be grateful for the things God is doing. Make sure to include a time of prayer at the beginning or end of each group meeting.
- Spiritual Component. The special thing about Connect Groups is the spiritual aspect that sets them apart from regular gatherings. We make sure to include the word of God in our group, either through activities or discussions. During Connect 40, we do both. The discussion guide helps us have meaningful spiritual conversations, and the action steps guide our activities. As hosts, we start each new meeting by giving each member a chance to share their experiences with the action steps from the previous week.

CONNECT 40 ADDITIONAL RESOURCES

Four things we ask you not to engage in during meetings:

- Business
- Offerings
- Unapproved materials or speakers
- Controversial Topics

These resources are designed to help you learn how to host a group during Connect 40. Gathering together is the most important part, and these resources provide a brief overview of the leader training provided to Connect Group leaders. We believe that your experience during Connect 40 will give you a valuable understanding of the significance of Connect Groups in our ministry. We hope it will also ignite your desire to participate in a group during the upcoming semesters.
